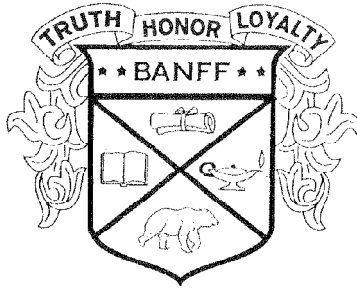

## Technology Acceptable Use Policy

### User Guidelines:

All users will be granted access to as many network services as their technology allows. Exploration of the Internet is encouraged within the bounds of The Banff School Acceptable Use Policy Statement of Purpose. Internet and computer access is a privilege, not a right, and inappropriate use will result in cancellation or suspension of the privilege. After basic training, users must display an understanding of the following acceptable and unacceptable uses to gain online access.

1. All use of the Internet and computers must be in support of education and research and consistent with the goals and objectives of The Banff School;
2. Network accounts are to be used only by the authorized user of the account for the authorized purpose;
3. Users shall not intentionally seek information on, obtain copies of, or modify files, other data, or passwords belonging to other users, or misrepresent other users on the network;
4. All communications and information accessible via the network should be assumed to be private property;
5. Users are not allowed to initiate subscriptions to newsgroups, listservs, and similar files unless approval from the Technology Coordinator is gained;
6. Any student work must be signed with the student's full name;
7. Individuals in pictures, movies or sound recordings may be identified only by initials (e.g. JQP for John Q. Public.) Absolutely no first or last names may appear in reference to the individuals in any image, movie, or sound recording;
8. Individuals who identify an inappropriate use of online resources or a security problem must notify supervisory staff;
9. While exercising the privilege of using the internet as an educational resource, users shall also monitor and accept the responsibility for all material received;
10. Only those students with Internet instruction shall be given the privilege of using the Internet;

11. No personal information about a student will be allowed to go out on the Internet. This includes home telephone numbers and addresses as well as information regarding the specific location of any student at any given time;
12. Any use of the network for commercial or for-profit purposes is prohibited;
13. Users have the responsibility of keeping all pornographic material, inappropriate text files, or files dangerous to the integrity of the network from entering the school via the Internet, and must report all violations to the supervisory staff;
14. No use of the network, such as, the use of obscene, abusive, or threatening messages, or chain letters, shall serve to disrupt the use of the network by others; hardware or software shall not be destroyed, modified, or abused in any way.
15. Malicious use of the network to develop programs that harass others or infiltrate a computer or computing system and/or damage the software components of a computer or computing system is prohibited;
16. Limits on the installation of copyrighted software are to be respected;
17. Students are not allowed to alter the overall functioning of a computer including changing of the desktop picture, changing the style of icons, changing the font or font size, changing or altering screen savers, or changing the layout of icons on the desktop;
18. No use of instant messaging services is allowed including but not limited to America Online Instant Messenger, Yahoo Instant Messenger, MSN Messenger, Windows Messenger, ICQ, Trillian, or IRC;
19. Downloading programs of **any** type is strictly prohibited and grounds for immediate suspension from computer use for the remainder of the school year;
20. Use of personal e-mail clients and accounts (whether local or Internet-based such as Outlook, Hotmail, Yahoo Mail, Eudora, etc.) is not allowed unless directly linked to a school assignment with permission granted from a member of the Banff faculty;
21. When necessary, The Banff School will make determinations on whether specific uses of the network and Internet are consistent with the Acceptable Use Policy.

### Misuses of Privileges and Consequences

The use of the computer labs and Internet is a privilege, not a right. The user will be held responsible for his/her actions and activities. Infractions of guidelines 1-9 will be dealt with as a Level 1 offense as detailed in The Banff School Student Handbook. Infractions of guidelines 10-21 will be dealt with as a Level II offense. All offenses will have the possible consequence of suspension from all computer activities for the remainder of the current school year.

## Permission for Student Use of Computer Labs & Internet
